We are constantly reviewing our supply chain with a particular focus on how we can support suppliers to become more sustainable, with a spotlight on regenerative agriculture supporting dairy farmers to reduce the emissions at farms and improving animal welfare practices.



To continue our progress to achieving Net Zero, we have adopted the following carbon targets.


- 1. Achieving net zero greenhouse gas emissions across our operations (1 & 2) by 2030.
- 2. Working towards a net zero value chain by 2050 as we continue to measure and reduce our Scope 3 emissions.

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CARBON REDUCTION PROJECTS

Completed Carbon Reduction Initiatives Since 2022, various environmental management initiatives and projects have been put into action.

OPERATIONS

Our energy management program extends throughout our factories and depots, aiming to streamline office spaces, enhance operational efficiency, and engage in targeted schemes. These schemes set forth objectives that we actively pursue to improve efficiency while concurrently reducing carbon emissions.

We have launched an initiative to move 14% of our managed sites to renewable energy in our factories and depots.

We have launched an initiative to transition to electric fleet in our downstream logistics.

To achieve a reduce in our waste emissions we have taken a steps to reduce single use plastic, we have launched milk cartons in June 2023. Cartons are 100% recyclable and reduce 70% plastic waste compared to HDPE poly bottles recyclability of these cartons are 77% in the UK and once recycled, the material can be repurposed to create new paper products and promote circular economy.

SUPPLIERS

To tackle impact beyond our direct operations, we have launched a sustainability scheme and appointed a 3rd party independent consultant for our farm suppliers to support engagement with over 100+ farmers to measure their GHG emissions and to reduce carbon footprint from the fat protein corrected milk (FPCM).

This scheme also covers animal welfare performance of our farmers and our independent consultant provide them with corrective actions to improve the animal health and adopt sustainable practices.

FOOD WASTE

To address the issue of food waste have launched an initiative to redistribute our food items fit for human consumption instead of sending them to waste stream and reduction of waste emissions.

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DECLARATION AND SIGN OFF

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been completed in accordance with PPN 06/21 and associated guidance and reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans. Emissions have been reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol Corporate Standard and uses the appropriate Government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting.

Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions have been reported in accordance with SECR requirements, and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions have been reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard.

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been reviewed and signed off by the board of directors.
